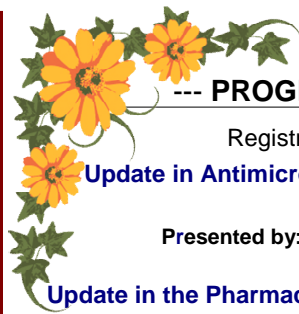
**Educational Objectives** - At the conclusion of the educational program, participants will be able to:

- 1) Describe considerations for selecting an antibiotic regimen and duration of therapy.
- 2) Recognize the burden of resistant organisms in causing community-acquired and health-care associated infections.
- 3) Apply knowledge of antimicrobials to effectively treat infections caused by these organisms.
- 4) Identify common indications for and summarize reasons for and against use of antimicrobial prophylaxis.
- 5) Describe antimicrobial stewardship and discuss why there is an increasing need for stewardship programs.
- 6) Recognize the cardiovascular risks of untreated hypertension in adults.
- 7) Review the most recent clinical trial information available to evaluate antihypertensive treatment regimens and blood pressure goals in adult patients.
- 8) Outline major treatment recommendations from published guidelines for the management of hypertension.
- 9) Discuss proper initiation, titration and monitoring of specific antihypertensive agents and drug classes.
- 10) Utilize patient cases to illustrate the role of a multidisciplinary care team in the management of adults with HTN: identification, treatment, counseling, and adherence.
- 11) Describe the FDA's concern and request for a Risk Evaluation and Mitigation Strategy (REMS) for prescribing opioids.
- 12) Discuss recent articles and concerns about the increase in mortality associated with opioid prescribing.
- 13) Discuss appropriate prescribing of acute and chronic opioid medications.
- 14) Distinguish between long-acting and immediate-release opioids, discussing unique delivery systems that make long-acting formulations risky for patients.
- 15) Identify measures to reduce deaths from opioid overdose and prescription drug abuse.
